Miguel Estrada is too much of a mystery to risk with our rights. Estrada, President Bush's nominee for a lifetime appointment to the second most important court in the United States — the D.C. Circuit Court — has refused to divulge his views on virtually any legal issues. The Department of Justice has refused to make public any memos Estrada wrote while working in the Solicitor General's office. And during his hearings, Mr. Estrada would not give his opinion on environmental, civil rights or women's rights cases, including Roe v. Wade. That leaves us with one, unanimous decision — to ask the U.S. Senate to Stop Estrada.
