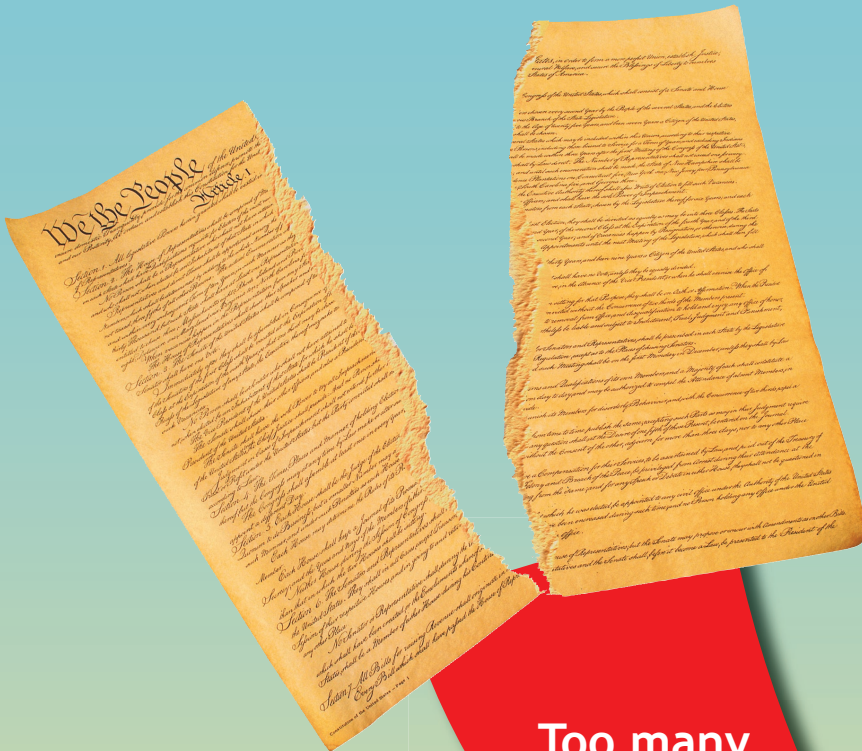

**Judicial Nominations: Our Environment's at Stake**

**CAROLYN KUHL** (9<sup>th</sup> Circuit nominee)— Urged the Supreme Court to overturn well-settled precedents in order to bar environmental and other groups from going to court to protect their members.

**WILLIAM PRYOR** (11<sup>th</sup> Circuit nominee)— Only state attorney general who argued to the Supreme Court that vital protections for clean water and endangered species are unconstitutional.

**JANICE ROGERS BROWN** (D.C. Circuit nominee)— supports returning to the universally denounced, early 1900s Lochner era when courts elevated corporate interests over individual rights, and believes that the Supreme Court's 1937 decision that the New Deal was constitutional "marks the triumph of our own socialist revolution."

The Senate should reject efforts to pack our federal courts with extreme, anti-environmental ideologues.
